Sakâw Askiy Management Inc. (Sakâw) and its shareholders are authorized to: establish temporary work camps to conduct forest operations on the PA FMA in the 2020-2021 operating year. This approval is a disposition to occupy the sites. Additional approvals to remove vegetation in areas outside of approved blocks and active company rights-of-way in the 2020-2021 operating plan approval is required.

Location: various locations across the PA FMA

Area Office: Prince Albert Forest Service

Special Conditions:

1. Sakâw and its shareholders are accountable for all activities carried out at any work camp covered under the authority of this permit.
2. Sakâw must identify to the Forest Service the shareholder responsible for each camp prior to establishment of said camps. Forest Service Officers responsible for the PA FMA must be kept informed of all camp locations within 1 week of establishment.
3. Sakâw and its shareholders must abide by: conditions Officers add to this permit; the PA FMA Standards for the establishment, operation and decommissioning of all camps; the “Conditions for the Establishment and Operation of Temporary Work Camps, 2020,” and section 17 of The Wildfire Act and section 5 of The Wildfire Regulations when it comes to burning at camps.
4. All fires must be contained to burning barrels and only wood and paper products are permitted to be burned. For any conflicts between the FMA Standards and the above conditions the standards supersede the conditions. All conditions set forth in the Sakâw 2020-2025 operating plan and approvals apply to this permit.
5. For the winter months only (November to March), section 2.b.i of the “Conditions for The Establishment and Operation of Temporary Work Camps 2020” is waived unless camp locations are within any “**shoreland development area**” as defined in section 2(r) of the *Shoreland Pollution Control Regulations, 1976*.
6. Any environmental code chapter or provincial standards developed during the timeframe of this permit take precedence over other conditions unless otherwise legislated.

Subject to provisions of the: *The Forest Resources Management Act; The Environmental Management Protection Act, 2010; The Provincial Lands Act; The Wildfire Act; The Public Health Act and associated Regulations.*

This permit expires: March 31, 2021
